

OBJECTIVE #1:

Coordinate the community level response to nonfatal shootings

Support partnerships of organizations serving victims of gun violence

Support implementation of Handle with Care (HWC)

OBJECTIVE #2: Increase the number evidence-based programs and trauma informed violence prevention programs

Support implementation of violence prevention strategies that address root causes of violence.

Increase access to high quality violence prevention programs that build competency in decision making for youth and young adults

Increase capacity of communities to mobilize and lead neighborhood-based violence prevention strategies

OBJECTIVE #3: Work with regional stakeholders to advance at least 1 recommendation from a previous regional public safety plan.

Support community residents in engaging system partners to build and improve relationships that promote residents' perceptions of public safety.






